EXAM PREREQUISITES:

Clinical seminar: In this way, the student can gain up to 30 points by actively participating in the preparation and implementation of the seminar as well as the discussion after the lecture, so depending on the performance, the student gains up to 20 points.

Essay: By creating a written seminar paper, a student can earn up to 20 points. The form, content, way of processing the given topic and the relevance of the data are evaluated. A list of seminar topics will be offered to students at the beginning of the course.

FINAL EXAM: Written exam 60 points that include the material of the entire course.
